



## LIFE GROUP GUIDE

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**REMINDER:** This guide is to be used as such, a guide. The questions should be used as conversation starters. Allow your students to come up with their own answers. Don't feel obligated to "get through" all the questions. However, do leave time for the living section at the end.

**Ice breaker:** Check in with your students about their last week, maybe highs and lows. **Be sure to check in with them to see how their week went. Be sure to talk about last weeks living section? How did they do? Any cool stories they want to share?**

**God's Story:**

**Psalm 119:9-16**

<sup>9</sup>How can a young man keep his way pure? By guarding it according to your word. <sup>10</sup>With my whole heart I seek you; let me not wander from your commandments! <sup>11</sup>I have stored up your word in my heart, that I might not sin against you. <sup>12</sup>Blessed are you, O Lord; teach me your statutes! <sup>13</sup>With my lips I declare all the rules of your mouth. <sup>14</sup>In the way of your testimonies I delight as much as in all riches. <sup>15</sup>I will meditate on your precepts and fix my eyes on your ways. <sup>16</sup>I will delight in your statutes; I will not forget your word.

**Hebrews 4:11-13**

<sup>11</sup>Let us therefore strive to enter that rest, so that no one may fall by the same sort of disobedience. <sup>12</sup>For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart. <sup>13</sup>And no creature is hidden from his sight, but all are naked and exposed to the eyes of him to whom we must give account.

**Reflection:**

1. Do you enjoy reading God's word? Why or why not?
2. What's hardest for you in reading God's word? What's easiest?
3. What do you think the point is in reading the bible?
4. Have you ever had a time when you read something from the bible and it really spoke to you?
5. Have you ever read something from the bible and felt like God was speaking straight to you?
6. What are some benefits to reading God's word?
7. What are some benefits to memorizing Gods word?
8. How might we encourage each other in reading God's word?

**Living:**

Commit to reading for a certain period of time every day this week, it can be 5 min or an hour, whatever you choose. Spend time meditating or thinking deeply about what you read and what God might be saying to you through what you read. Challenge yourself to memorize one section of scripture. Maybe make it one of the ones above.

**Be sure to take time and pray with the students and leave 15 minutes at the end to come back together**
