Connect (15-20 mins)



2. 5. How do you think our culture quietly disciplines us in the way we think about money—and how does that differ from what we saw in Scripture during the sermon?
6. Do you agree with this statement?: *If the amount of time we spend in the Word or in prayer is an indication of spiritual maturity, then so is how we exercise biblical generosity.* Why or why not?
7. **Read Acts 2:44-45.** Describe the attitude of the early church when it came to generosity. How can we emulate this mentality in our context today?

Practice: Foundational Practice - Giving Generously
